Let's Bring Our Own Device to the Classroom!

In the 21st century, electronic gadgets are widely used in every facet of our lives. CFS believes that every CFSer should have the ability to access and thrive in this technological advanced society. Therefore, the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) policy has been introduced this academic year to provide students with their own personal iPad and Apple Pencil in order to facilitate their learning activities at school. The program would be implemented to the whole school in stages. In this academic year, S1 and S4 students have taken part. What an exciting change it is!

Students use their iPads and Apple Pencils in multiple ways, but the most useful learning tool may be the note-taking app GoodNotes. GoodNotes allows students to take notes with annotations, highlight important points, and even add shapes and pictures. Similar to how virtual files are organized, all notes can be renamed, searched and retrieved within seconds at students' convenience, if not more handy than using physical folders.

Some S1 students have been keeping an English bullet journal and reading log in the app. This allows them to learn more effectively while vividly expressing their creativity. To broaden their horizons of food culture around the world and acquire the skills of food description, they were asked to do independent research and present the results in their journals.





Drawing the important scenes and characters in a creative and personalised way when reading the class reader, they gain a deeper understanding of the basic plot of the story. The more aesthetic they make their notes, the higher chance they will spend time referring back to them, which is the reason why we take notes, right? In contrast to traditional black-and-white note taking, it not only creates a spark in English learning, but also caters for different learning styles.



For instance, in this written note, a map is pasted to act as visual aid to enhance the students' understanding of geographical locations in Hong Kong.

Another function, the Shape Tool, has also brought substantial convenience especially to students studying science or technology related subjects. The tool turns handdrawn shapes into perfect geometric ones. Students can also

use their device for graphs and mindmaps, making them neater and better organized. After completion, the notes are shareable so that students can collaborate in class as well.





All in all, CFSers have definitely enjoyed the benefits of the groundbreaking BYOD policy. Technology will continue to play an indispensable role in our learning, with or without the pandemic. With this in mind, we are eagerly anticipating the day when this policy can be fully implemented.

Your Future School is just a Click away: CFS Virtual Campus To

School visit at your prospective secondary school is cancelled due to the pandemic? Just go virtual!

Standing in front of a camera at the school entrance, a student introduces the rules of the game to the audience. 'Good take!' K.C., the campus TV assistant and former campus TV chief editor, says with a grin.

They are filming for the Virtual Campus Tour.

The global pandemic has been disrupting everyone's lives since last year and many events had to be cancelled or reimagined, with our annual Info Day being one of them. Understanding the importance of visiting prospective secondary schools for the P6 students, our school's Publicity Committee decided to get creative and arranged a virtual tour online. This Virtual Campus Tour allows the public, particularly primary 6 students who would like to attend our school with their parents, to get to know more about our CFS campus, and more importantly our school spirit and culture.

The Virtual Campus Tour can be accessed on our school website and is conducted via videos. Students in the videos share their school life while showing the visitors around. To get to the next room, visitors need to click the correct answer at the end of the videos after listening to clues given to them by our students.



"Instead of having the Virtual Tour working like a 'Google Map' that visitors just click and look at different places in our school, we would like them to also know more about school life at PLKCFS," says Mr. K.C. Chow, the teacher-in-charge of the scheme. He would like to thank his teammates, Mr. M. Trottier and Mr. K.Y. Leung, for coming up with a brilliant idea together, making it like a "Treasure Hunt". By asking the virtual visitors to answer questions to find the next stop on the tour, the tour is like a game and much more engaging.

Concerns about the effectiveness of this innovative project compared to the conventional face-to-face Info day are inevitable. "Regarding this concern, I would say that I both agree and disagree," Mr. Chow replies. He explains that it is true that by being physically present on the campus, parents and primary students are able to talk to our teachers and students in person, as well as observe the performances of

our students. Hence, face-to-face info days are undeniably valuable. However, he goes on to explain that some of the parents and primary students may have other commitments

which would force them to miss our Info Day. Besides that, Tung Chung is developing at full speed and more families are moving in recently. It may be difficult for some of these families from other districts to travel to Tung Chung to visit our school on the ordinary days, whereas the Virtual Campus Tour allows them to visit our school anytime and anywhere as long as they have digital devices. "In the end, we may be able to reach more people in this way," he concludes. The way he sees it is that the Virtual Tour is more flexible and far-reaching, but it is also inevitably less interactive than the conventional approach.

The production process was never easy. K.C., the campus TV assistant, explains, "The secret to the tour's appeal is that it combines high quality videos along with a high degree of interaction with the visitor. I mainly took part in the filming and editing of the videos."

While describing the challenges of the production process, he adds, "Owing to the limited contact time between students and teachers during the pandemic, Mr. Chow and I needed to film in different places at recesses or before classes started in the morning." They needed to finish the whole production within three days. Nobody expected the production of a Virtual Campus Tour to be easy, but with the help of all of our school's professional video production equipment, K.C. was able to produce a professional and marvellous video. However, even with all the technology in the world, K.C. wants to point



out that this tour only became a reality because of the collaborative spirit of the teachers and students. He wants to thank all the CFSers who assisted in the project!

The pandemic isn't just doom and gloom. We have succeeded in overcoming hurdles after hurdles thanks to technological advancement. More "good takes" by CFSers are sure to come!



見及感受,令學校明白我們的需要,加強了溝通呢!所以,大家都要相信自己的力量,為自己、為身邊人而嘗試及努力!




現屆學牛會:水星MERCURY
